Dress Code

4.8 General - The Club Executive has approved the following dress policy for the Club. The dress regulations take into consideration current trends in golf wear and practices of other golf clubs. The purpose of these dress regulations is to develop an underlying spirit where all members and their guests respect each other and honour the traditions of the Club by wearing proper attire, which is clean, neat and tidy when on Club property. The following standards apply to all members, their guests and tournament participants, and must be maintained at all times:

4.9 In the Clubhouse:

- a. Casual dress is permitted;
- b. Denim garments in good condition of any colour are permitted in the clubhouse; they must be presentable (no holes, tears);
- c. No muscle tops or undershirts or shower sandals (flip flops);
- d. No spandex or yoga pants, no profane logos or writing on clothing, no halter or tube tops;
- e. Uniform dress is permitted in the Clubhouse;
- f. Golf headdress, including hats, visors and headbands, are permitted in the clubhouse, however all members and guests are requested to remove their headdress while in the Dining Room;
- g. Sport shirt/tee-shirt with slacks, shorts (dress type), sandals or shoes, dress, skirt or slacks with blouse are permitted; and
- h. All clothing will be neat and clean.

4.10 On the Golf Premises:

- a. Denim garments are prohibited on the golf courses and practice areas.
- b. Sweatpants, jogging pants/shorts, spandex, non-belted golf style shorts/pants with exterior pockets, cut-offs and T-shirts are prohibited;
- c. Uniform attire is not permitted on the golf course or on the practice areas;
- d. Footwear that could damage the course is not permitted on the golf course or on the practice areas. Golf sandals (without socks) are permitted; and
- e. Hylands is a soft spike facility hard spikes will not be permitted under any circumstance.

4.11 Ladies and Junior/Intermediate Girls:

- Long trousers or tailored slacks, Capri pants, skorts, belted golf style shorts with exterior pockets, golf shirts, turtleneck blouses/sweaters, golf dresses and shorts may be worn;
- Shirts designed to be worn over slacks/shorts/skirts/skorts are permitted providing they have a finished bottom; and
- c. Tank tops, tube tops, scooped necklines, bare midriffs are not permitted.

4.12 Gentlemen and Junior/Intermediate Boys:

a. Shirts with attached collars, turtleneck shirts and mock turtlenecks (short or long

- sleeve) may be worn;
- b. While it is preferred that shirts remain tucked in, shirts designed to be worn over slacks/shorts are permitted providing they have a finished bottom; and
- c. Long trousers or tailored slacks, "Plus Fours", walking type shorts or belted golf style pants or shorts with exterior pockets may be worn. Shorts must be no shorter than mid-thigh and no longer than knee length and must be worn with socks or sockettes, except when sandals are worn.
- 4.13 Juniors General: Hylands recognizes that children's clothing trends often vary from adults; therefore, Juniors will be permitted some leniency provided their attire is in good taste. Parents or sponsors are responsible for ensuring that no prohibited items are worn and the juniors' attire adheres as closely as possible to the Dress Code.

4.14 Authority:

- a. Members are responsible for the dress of their guests at all times while they are on Club property; and
- b. The authority to apply and enforce this dress code is vested in Board Members, the General Manager, Event Co-ordinators, Professional Staff, Club Captain, Starters and Marshals.
